# Wild Law



**Ian Mason** is a practicing barrister, Director of the Earth Justice Legal Resource Centre run by the Gaia Foundation, and is also Head of Law and Economics in the School of Economic Science. He has lectured and written widely on the relationship of nature and her laws to formal law, economics and governance.



**Carine Nadal** joined the Gaia Foundation as a legal research officer in March 2008. She completed a Masters in Environmental Law at Kings College, London and previous research experience were with the Environmental Law Foundation, United Nations Institute for Training and Research and IUCN.



The ideas of Wild Law and Earth Jurisprudence, aimed at protecting all the Earth's community – including animals, plants, rivers and ecosystems - are increasingly being discussed among lawyers, environmental scientists, policy researchers and academics and have begun to be translated into practice through the enactment of laws in several jurisdictions. Representatives from the UK Environmental Law Association (UKELA) will be talking us through the concepts and shedding light on how we can rethink our legal and political systems to stop environmental destruction.
