PART 1 - The Visioning Day

The event was held on Saturday 30 May 2009 at All Saints Church, Kingston, 11am-4pm.

It consisted of several displays, posters, a town map and sheets with post-it stickers/colour pens inviting comment from members of the public on their attitudes and aspirations for the future in Kingston (see appendix for questions asked). There was also face painting and refreshments.

About 20 volunteers helped organise and run the day. The event clashed with the FA Cup Final and fine weather outside; still, over 100 people came to look and around 60 people contributed, with over 300 suggestions/points received.

Possible implications: How people define quality of life

Community

- The top embodiment of 'the good life' was a leisurely meal with family or friends.
- Many people said what they valued about Kingston was their friends or 'local people', showing the importance of community to them.
- Many people wanted broad, inclusive environmental education, including practical advice on growing food, saving energy and recycling
- Some wanted better amusements for young children, and community centres

Food and resource use

- More local food was the single most popular aspiration
- Better recycling was the second most popular aspiration

Transport

- Better cycling facilities was the third most popular aspiration.
- Many people wanted less traffic/congestion/pollution.
- Many wanted better public transport

Landscape and nature

- The river and green spaces were Kingston's most cherished features.
- Many wanted more vegetation in town centres.
- Many wanted less litter.
- Some wanted better conservation of nature; some valued the market place and other historic buildings

Economy and work

- Many saw the need for a new green economy. <u>No-one</u> thought we could simply spend our way out of recession.
- Despite the fact that we lured people off the shopping streets, **no-one** mentioned the shops in their list of favourite things, nor did they talk about the night-life (pubs, bars, restaurants, clubs).
